**Summary Issue: Seasonal Resilience Funding**

<b>Question</b>	<b>Response</b>
1. How much seasonal resilience funding your CCG received in 2014/15, and how much it has been allocated for 2015/16	<p>In 2014/15 the CCG received total additional allocation of £5.99m from NHS England for winter resilience. This funding was received in two separate tranches.</p> <p>In 2015/16 the CCG are required to fund winter resilience schemes from their baseline allocation. Bristol CCG has identified budget of £4.786m for winter resilience schemes.</p>
2. Please provide a breakdown of the purposes for which the 2015/16 funding has been used for	<p>The applications of this budget are as set out below:</p> <p>In the acute trusts – schemes to provide resilience to providing services across seven days, including access to consultant cover, diagnostics and therapies in both the adults’ and children’s hospitals. There are also schemes to facilitate timely discharges.</p> <p>In the community there are multiple schemes to support admission avoidance, and discharge at the front door, including investments in advanced nursing roles and therapy teams.</p> <p>Furthermore, investments supports the transformation discharge to assess project which, in partnership with Bristol City Council, supports patients to have decisions about their longer term care needs made in more appropriate venues, including at home when this can be facilitated. There are three pathways (Home with Support, Community Rehab Beds and Complex Assessment Beds). Resilience funding contributes by finding bedded resources and key staffing roles, such as social work and nursing posts.</p>
